
Reading




Each week, our class will study one text in our Guided Reading (Reading Masters) sessions. We will focus on the reading skills of decoding, identifying the features and purposes of texts, retrieving information, use of vocabulary and inference skills. All pupils will have a levelled (Big Cat) reading book. Pupils should read at least 3 times a week and will receive merits for their efforts.

Writing

This term, we are going to recount the life of a person who changed the world. We will plan writing, taking account of audience and purpose, use a range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs, as well as using relative clauses, prepositional phrases and expanded noun phrases.





In the next unit we will write a modern-day adventure story. Our focus will be on dialogue, adverbial clauses, subordinate clauses, prepositional phrases, expanded noun phrases and parenthesis.
