
Reading



Each week, our class will study one text in our Guided Reading (Reading Masters) sessions. We will focus on the reading skills of decoding, identifying the features and purposes of texts, retrieving information, use of vocabulary and inference skills.

Each child has a Big Cat book to read at home. We regularly check that they are on the correct colour band.

Our class book this term is 'The Boy Who Biked The World' by Alastair Humphreys.



Writing

This term, we will explore a range of text types and their features, before writing our own.

These will include:

- **Persuasive holiday adverts** (based on The Boy Who Biked The World)
- **Instructions** (based on The Boy Who Biked The World)
- **Setting descriptions** (based on extracts from The Secret Garden)
- Calligrams and Shape Poems (based on the poem Next Door's Cat)

Spelling

We have carefully assessed where the children are in their phonics and spelling and they are working in groups, on the appropriate sounds and spellings.



Pupils are expected to read their Big Cat books at home at least 3 times a week. Please record this in their reading records. Other reading can also be included.

In year 3, we check reading records on a daily basis.

Maths

The children should be practising their times tables daily. It is expected that they already know their 2s, 10s and 5s and this year they will learn their 3s, 4s and 8s.

Children will have access to Times Tables
Rockstars to support their learning. Times Tables Rockstars improves children's recall speed and also boosts their confidence. In school we will set times tables competitions between classes and year groups.

In year 3, children's times tables development will be assessed regularly.


All the children should have a Times Tables Rockstars account and we will soon begin battles between classes.





P.E.

Year 3 all have PE on Mondays and Tuesdays.

Pupils are expected to wear full PE kit including:

- Royal blue t-shirt (with school logo)
- Royal blue shorts (no bermuda style or lycra shorts please)

- Trainers
