

Many thanks for your cooperation in keeping our school safe for all.




## Trees, leaves and other green news

Another aspect of personal safety is staying safe online. At the start of each year, all the children learn about online safety. This week the whole school are working to identify who their top five 'trusted adults' are, and discussing how to talk to adults if something worries them online.

## Parking outside school

The church have kindly agreed that school parents can continue to use the church car park at busy times this year. We extend our thanks to them — the extra space really helps. They have asked that parents please be understanding of the times when they have occasional services such as funerals, and the car park is not available.

We thank all our parents for being considerate of other road users and residents at drop off and pick up times. There is plenty of space along Sedgemoor Road around the bend at the end of the road for additional parking and it is only a short walk to school.

Please remember not to park on yellow lines or across a residents driveway. Act as you would like people to act where you live.

Please can we also remind all families that **only those who need to access our disabled parking should be entering and leaving the school site by car for collection and drop off**. This is to ensure the safety of our whole school community.

If you are entering the site by car, please do this at a **slow speed** as children can be unpredictable at times. If you do need to park on-site, please also make sure **your engine is turned off** as per Rule 123 of The Highway Code; drivers must not leave a vehicle engine running unnecessarily while the vehicle is stationary on a public road.
