Attendance Matters

- The best way to support your child is to have them in school whenever possible
- Children who do well are the children who have > 95% attendance
- Every day missed is 5 hours of learning, your child will miss
- Sometimes illness does require time off to recuperate



Importance of Reading



- Children who read make the most progress and have the most confidence
- Children should aim to read every day for at least 5 minutes
- Children should record their own reading if possible
- An adult should sign reading entries to confirm reading has happened
- Reading records are checked regularly (often daily)
- Every reading entry is rewarded with merits
- Children should still read to an adult on occasion
- If your child needs guidance on book choices, please ask
