## Rationale

We believe that it is important for every child to attend school in full uniform, with clean face and hands. A clean, smart appearance and the wearing of uniform have a number of advantages:

- 1. Our children are easily identified for security reasons;
- Children associate their uniforms with settled behaviour and work; 2.

- 3. All children look and are treated as equals;
- 4. Uniform limits the influence of fashion and status;
- 5. Wearing uniform helps children to take pride in their school;
- 6. Other clothes are kept good for life outside school.

We greatly appreciate the support of parents/carers with uniform.

We believe that what a child wears to school reflects their learning. We want our children to be proud of their school and we feel that by wearing the school's smart but simple uniform, our children portray the school's ethos and shared positive values.

PMG Schoolwear supply our uniform; they are our main supplier and offer uniform items with and without logos. They are based in the Eden Centre in High Wycombe and orders can be placed online, and you can also visit their shop to view items and purchase direct. Your child may also wear any uniform items as per below guidelines purchased from any of the main supermarkets or other retailers if preferred. On the PMG Schoolwear website, you are able to purchase an iron on school logo that you can put on any non-branded items purchased that are required to have the school logo – see below for which items these are.

#### **School uniform**

- School Tie
- White Shirt (not open neck blouse)
- Grey Skirt or Pinafore (approximately knee length), or grey trousers/shorts
- Grey or White Socks (knee or ankle length only)
- Grey Tights
- Royal Blue Cardigan/Unisex Jumper/Sweatshirt (with school logo)
- Black Shoes (up to 3cm heel only)

No boots, wedges or strapless sandals.

In the summer term, after the Easter holidays, children may wear summer uniform of white polo shirt (optional logo polo shirt available) or blue and white summer dress, or playsuit.

The children should wear a sun hat and/or sun screen when appropriate.

#### PE Kit

- Royal blue t-shirt (with school logo)
- Royal blue shorts (long cycling shorts, at least mid-thigh to knee length)

\*Nike Pro style mini lycra shorts are not suitable for school.

- Plain navy blue or black jogging bottoms (or navy blue or black leggings) and sweatshirt may be worn over PE kit in winter
- Plain black or white trainers for outdoor games

Please mark all items of clothing with the child's name because school cannot accept responsibility for lost jumpers, trainers, etc.

#### Hair

Long hair should be tied back using plain blue, white or red hair bands or small hair slides.

\*large bows, ribbons and claw clips are not suitable for school uniform Extreme hairstyles and dyed hair are not permitted.

#### Footwear / Jewellery

- Ears may be pierced and one single pair of plain studs may be worn in school.
- Pupils are not allowed to wear any jewellery for PE including earrings. Newly pierced ears must be taped before school and children should be able to remove their own earrings after the initial six-week period.
- No other jewellery is permitted.
- No nail varnish or make-up is permitted.
- Digital and analogue watches are permitted but should be removed for PE.
- Children may wear simple step trackers but these should not be capable of receiving or sending messages or pictures. Expensive items are worn at parents' own risk.

### Sustainable uniform shop

A sustainable uniform shop will be held each half-term after school in the library or hall. Items here will all be good quality and will have been washed prior to resale. Items in the sustainable uniform shop will be for sale according to availability. Items in the sustainable uniform shop will be available at reduced prices.
